I thought I was having a great deal of bad luck getting back for arrangements were made at least four times for my return and each time some thing happened to prevent it. I was certain that some of the boys would be back before I managed it and was surprised to be the first back.

I never got back four days after I did. The people who hid me had told me that all the boys were safely hidden and I was very relieved, but of course I later found out it was not so.

I am home until the 28th. Then must report to Santa Monica for redistribution. Where I'll go from there I don't know.

It is wonderful to be back. I only wish Dick could have returned also. I hope it will be over soon so he can come home to you.
